Instead, its main goal is to present available innovative solutions and active research projects, as well as novel ideas for new project proposals.

Novel ideas for new project proposals are also welcome. Submitted extended abstract will undergo a review process to check their relevance to the workshop.

The submission of a contribution implies that, if accepted for presentation, at least one of its proponents must register and attend the workshop for giving the presentation.

Submission Instructions

Potential contributors are requested to send an extended abstract that briefly describes the project, or project idea, to be presented. Both active and recently terminated projects can be considered. Novel ideas for new proposals are also welcome.

Extended abstracts must be submitted in English, PDF format in IEEE template, and should not exceed 2 pages in size. Submission is through EasyChair (see the website for details).
